Instead of just reducing the amount of paper being used in exercising its functions, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of San Juan City is now "paperless" during sessions and committee hearings starting November 7, 2022.

With this in mind and with the help of technology, they started using their tablets with apps that make it easier for them to view every document and edit the same as well, instead of using printed documents.

Through the internet, members of the council can receive and store files in their respective devices to make them readily accessible during their sessions and committee hearings. They can also edit, make notes and comments and even agree, object and approve ordinances and resolutions online.



It is another innovation for the San Juan City Council, better than the other local governments' as this is totally "zero-paper" and not just less.

The challenges brought about by climate change has encouraged the San Juan City Council to contribute in reducing carbon emissions through the use of technology. Its brilliant mind and the love for the environment has brought its efficient public service to the next level.
