

## 5. AVAILING OF ANTI-RABIES VACCINE

It is a health service provided at the Animal Bite Treatment Center (ABTC) to help animal bite victims receive timely rabies post-exposure prophylaxis. ABTCs are allowed to charge patients for consumables, (such as syringes and for eRIG if required), but shall not charge for government provided vaccine. Patients also need to cover their travel expenses and the cost of their time to attend the ABTC.
