## 21. MANAGEMENT OF SEVERELY ACUTE MALNUTRITION (SAM)

The integrated management of SAM is a public health strategy to address severe acute malnutrition. It focuses on the integration of effective management of SAM into the on-going routine health and nutrition services at all levels while still striving for maximum coverage through maintaining a strong community component. It also aims to make links across the wider sectors to ensure that treatment is linked to support for continued rehabilitation of cases and sits as a component of the wider Philippine strategy for malnutrition prevention focusing on the critical 1,000-day window.
